As many of you may know, I have traveled like many of you using the IPA. We encourage you, if you travel, to submit articles to the Region newsletter, even if your travels were only to Dania. The IPA site shows the many trips and functions that other sections and regions are presenting. Use them.

The Barcelona Spain Region Section offered a trip in May-June this year which I personally attended and consider one of the best IPA trips I've ever attended. It was called, "Romantic Week" (May 27th– June 2nd with an extension to "1001 Nights" in Morocco (June 2-7). I must say that they were great!

Augustin Gonzalez of Barcelona was the coordinator. Thanks to Augustin, the trip will have many fond memories. It was all inclusive with visits, three meals daily and many surprises.

Spain has a population of 48 million with 17 different regions. The Catalonia Region, as many of you might recall, unsuccessfully attempted to secede from Spain. Catalonia is an autonomous community that is located on the Iberian Peninsula of Spain. Four provinces make up Catalonia: Barcelona, Lleida, Girona and Tarragona. The total population of the region is 7,522,596 and is home to about 16% of Spain's total population.

This trip included the Sagrada Familia Tour, Rickshaw bike ride, Ice bar, Experience Montserrat Tour, Freixenet Winery Tour, boat ride, Old Town Tour, makeup sessions (only for the ladies) and a romantic dinner with a visit from an Elvis personality. The hotel was the "Agua Hotel Silhouette" in Malgrat de Mar, just north of Barcelona.

Upon traveling to Africa, the extension in Morocco was a very rewarding experience. We flew from Barcelona to Marrakech, a 2-1/2 hour flight. Marrakech, an old modern city many years ago, was the capital which now has a population of 750,000. The scenery and stops everyday into the countryside was amazing and my fondness now of the Moroccan people. A thing to remember was our overnight stay in tents on the Sahara Desert, with camel rides and the most beautiful sunrise.

I will make this trip again and have discussed it with Augustin. For both trips it cost was 1775 Euros (roughly \$2,000 U.S.) per couple with everything included. Additional cost was the return airfare back to Barcelona.

There were 50 people for the Romantic Week trip with 30 of us from the United States, two from Canada, and others from different areas of the world including, Australia, Germany and the United Kingdom. The Moroccan trip had 54 people with members from Portugal joining us. Photos are depicted on the next two pages.



THE HISTORY OF INDEPENDENCE DAY 2019 DATES BACK TO THE 18TH CENTURY AND THE AMERICAN

REVOLUTION (1775-1783). In June 1776, representatives of the 13 colonies then fighting in the revolutionary struggle weighed a resolution that would declare independence of the United States from Great Britain. On July 2, the legal separation of the Thirteen Colonies from Great Britain occurred, when the Second Continental Congress voted to approve a resolution of independence that had been proposed by Richard Henry Lee of Virginia. Two days later its delegates adopted the Declaration of Independence, a historic document drafted by Thomas Jefferson, John Adams, and Benjamin Franklin.

There were 56 signers of the Declaration. The day is celebrated with parades, barbeques, picnics, baseball games, concerts, family reunions, and of course, fireworks. A day many Americans display the flag in a show of their patriotism and love for the United States. Personally, I fly the flag of the United States every day.

Labor Day is an annual holiday to celebrate the economic and social contributions of workers to the strength, prosperity, and well-being of the country. In the United States, Labor Day is a federal holiday observed on the first Monday of September. In the United States, Labor Day is customarily viewed as the end of the summer vacation season, although school starting times now may vary.

Labor Day has its origins in the labor union movement, specifically the eight-hour day movement, which advocated eight hours for work, eight hours for recreation, and eight hours for rest. In the United States the first Labor Day holiday was celebrated on Tuesday, September 5, 1882, in New York City. The idea spread with the growth of labor organizations, and in 1885 Labor Day was celebrated in many industrial centers of the country. Oregon was the first state to make it a holiday on February 21, 1887. By the time it became a federal holiday in 1894, thirty states officially celebrated Labor Day. The day is celebrated with parades, barbeques and picnics.

If any of you have ever been to a military funeral in which taps was played; this brings out a new meaning of it. Here is something Every American should know. We in the United States have all heard the haunting song, 'Taps...' It's the song that gives us the lump in our throats and usually tears in our eyes. But, do you know the story behind the song? If not, I think you will be interested to find out about its humble beginnings.

Reportedly, it all began in 1862 during the Civil War, when Union Army Captain Robert Elli was with his men near Harrison's Landing in Virginia. The Confederate Army was on the other side of the narrow strip of land. During the night, Captain Elli heard the moans of a soldier who lay severely wounded on the field. Not knowing if it was a Union or Confederate soldier, the Captain decided to risk his life and bring the stricken man back for medical attention. Crawling on his stomach through the gunfire, the Captain reached the stricken soldier and began pulling him toward his encampment..

When the Captain finally reached his own lines, he discovered it was actually a Confederate soldier, but the soldier was dead. The Captain lit a lantern and suddenly caught his breath and went numb with shock. In the dim light, he saw the face of the soldier. It was his own son. The boy had been studying music in the South when the war broke out. Without telling his father, the boy enlisted in the Confederate Army. The following morning, heartbroken, the father asked permission of his superiors to give his son a full military burial, despite his enemy status. His request was only partially granted.

The Captain had asked if he could have a group of Army band members play a funeral dirge for his son at the funeral. The request was turned down since the soldier was a Confederate. But, out of respect for the father, they did say they could give him only one musician.

The Captain chose a bugler. He asked the bugler to play a series of musical notes he had found on a piece of paper in the pocket of the dead youth's uniform. This wish was granted.

The haunting melody, we now know as 'Taps' used at military funerals was born. The words are:

Day is done.
Gone the sun.
From the lakes
From the hills.
From the sky.
All is well.
Safely rest.
God is nigh.

Fading light.
Dims the sight.
And a star
Gems the sky.
Gleaming bright.
All is well.
Safely rest.
God is nigh.


Thanks and praise.


